# Service

Lambda Zeta members are dedicated to helping bring forth opportunities that aim to advance fellow students towards their goals and aspirations. Our chapter actively seeks out ways to better our local community. Throughout the year we focused on serving our UNT community along with our local community.

This year's activities included fundraisers for our IEEE societies, Future Innovator's Workshop (STEM Outreach), Recitations, Study Halls, advising, and multiple workshops.



#### Future Innovator's Workshop



Lambda Zeta officers fundraised, organized, and ran a virtual STEM outreach event that reached more than 85, K-12 students all around the United States starting on 2/20 and 2/21. We assembled a kit, developed a manual, and provided instructional workshops even after The Great Texas Freeze plunged Texas into sub-zero weather the prior weeks.

We had to contend with ice and snow, rolling power outages, and bursting water pipes that fried computers, yet we still persevered and put on the workshop for the kids. Due to the February power outages we added 4 additional sessions to accommodate students that were unable to attend. Post event feedback was great, emphasizing the quality of the session, kit, and workbook.







Undergraduate Academic Guidebook 2020-2021





This year's activities included many virtual events like Founder's Day, Annual EE Town Hall, game nights, and socials.




#### Founder's Day




